TYPES OF CERTIFICATES AND CERTIFICATIONS OFFERED BY AzCFSE

- **Certificates of completion:**
 - Provided for candidates who complete approved workshops conducted by approved instructors
 - Workshops do not require certification exams
- **Certifications for accredited programs:**
 - Firefighter I & II and Hazardous Materials Awareness and Operations require AZCFSE **written and practical exam** testing prior to certification being issued
- **Certifications for other programs:**
 - Other programs that require only written exam testing may be **state certifications**, but not accredited by IFSAC

CERTIFICATES OF COMPLETION

- Not the same as a certification, which requires testing by AzCFSE
- The **approved instructor** may request certificates of completion by turning in required documents listed on the forms page at azfiretraining.org:
 - **Workshop Request Form**
 - **Facilities Verification Form**
 - **Syllabus**
- At the conclusion of the program an **official roster form** is turned in along with certificate fees.
- Allows for **recognition** of successful completion by attendees through a certificate and a record in the AZCFSE training records database.

WHAT IS THE VALUE OF CERTIFICATION?

- Documents **achievement** independent of the organization
- Provides **credibility** to an organization, and its membership as fire professionals
- Allows for individual **recognition** of success demonstrated through 3rd party testing

WHY DO DEPARTMENTS WANT ARIZONA CERTIFICATION?

- Time has proven the **validity** of Arizona Certification
- Acceptance has proven the **value** of Arizona Certification



THE ADJUNCT INSTRUCTOR IS A VALUABLE PART OF THE ARIZONA CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

Adjunct Instructors Are:

- Directly responsible for **acceptance** and **respect** of Certification
- Set the quality of knowledge for each program
- Responsible for the skill abilities of program participants



WHAT IS ARIZONA CERTIFICATION and HOW DO YOU GET IT?

- Certification is a voluntary program offered by AzCFSE
 - No state law requires certification
- To request certification testing, a program must meet AzCFSE program requirements
- Individuals within each program:
 - Must meet the **prerequisites** and successfully complete an approved certification program
 - Test for competency under the **NFPA** standard

- HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AWARENESS & OPERATIONS - IFSAC
- HAZARDOUS MATERIALS TECHNICIAN - IFSAC (PHOENIX FIRE DEPARTMENT)
- FIRE INSTRUCTOR I & II
- FIRE OFFICER I & II - IFSAC
- FIRE INSPECTOR I & II
- FIRE INVESTIGATOR I & II

ARIZONA CERTIFICATION STANDARDS AND PERFORMANCE CRITERIA

CERTIFICATION TESTS ARE BASED ON **NFPA**
STANDARDS

- FIRE FIGHTER I&II, NFPA 1001
- HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AWARENESS & OPERATIONS, NFPA 472
- FIRE INSPECTOR I & II, NFPA 1031
- FIRE INSTRUCTOR I & II, NFPA 1041
- FIRE OFFICER I & II, NFPA 1021

WHAT IS IFSAC?

INTERNATIONAL FIRE SERVICE ACCREDITATION CONGRESS

- A peer-driven organization
- Created to raise the level of **professionalism** in the fire service
- Accredits fire service training entities by peer review of program outcome testing to a **national standard**
- IFSAC is **not** a certification
 - individuals cannot be certified by IFSAC
- IFSAC is an **ACCREDITATION** of a certifying agency's testing process
- **Visit** the AzCFSE website for the most up-to-date information regarding IFSAC membership and accreditation (azfiretraining.org)

STARTING A CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

- An approved **Arizona Adjunct Instructor** must submit the course in advance and conduct the program
- Prior to first class, and **at least 60 days prior** to the date you want to have certification testing, submit at minimum:
 - **Application & Test Request Form**
 - **Facilities Verification Form**
 - **Class syllabus**
- Additional paperwork required for testing:
 - **Initial roster** with EIN's two weeks after class starts (Firefighter Programs)
 - The **Final roster** is due three weeks prior to testing (All Programs)
 - If there are any changes after you turn it in just notify AzCFSE staff by email

FACILITIES VERIFICATION FORM

This form declares:

- The course will use appropriate classroom areas:
 - **Lighted**
 - **Heated/cooled**
 - **Comfortable**
- The course will use equipment meeting applicable NFPA standards
- Classes will be conducted at **recognized emergency services department or college facilities**

THE COURSE SYLLABUS & LESSON PLAN

The Syllabus and lesson plan should show **who, what, when, where** :

- **Who** is hosting the class and **who** is instructing
- **When** and **where** are classes held
- **What** are the requirements, prerequisites and expectations.
- **What** curriculum is used
- **What** topics are covered and how many hours are in the program
 - Keep classroom hours separate from skill practice on your submitted lesson plan

Firefighter Program Requirements Form

Firefighter programs must submit the Firefighter Program Requirements Form:

- Indicate total **classroom hours** and **skill hours**.
- There are no minimum required skill hours but the program Adjunct Instructor must ensure that all students are proficient in all skills prior to testing
- Other prerequisites for testing are listed: EMS, Hazardous Materials, etc.

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Firefighter I & II Program and Course Syllabus Requirements

Instructions: Enter the information requested below, sign and date the form at the bottom, and turn in to AZCFSE along with the following: 1) A New Program Application & Test Request form, 2) Facilities Verification Form, and 3) A syllabus/Training schedule which shows that the prerequisites and requirements for certification testing listed below are met

COURSE DESCRIPTION			
The Firefighter I and II Certification Program must meet the requirements of NFPA 1001, 2013 Edition, and include all requirements listed below.			
SYLLABUS/TRAINING SCHEDULE			
A syllabus and Training Schedule meeting the course requirements outlined below must be presented to AZCFSE with a New Program/Test Request Form and a Facilities Verification form.			
REQUIRED STUDENT TEXT / REFERENCE MATERIALS			
The written exam will be based on questions which reference: IFSTA "Essentials of Fire Fighting", 6th Ed, and Jones and Bartlett "Fundamental of Fire Fighter Skills", 3rd Ed.			
REQUIRED COURSE TOPICS & HOURS			
The following must be met for course completion	List Total Program Cognitive/ Classroom Hours below	List Total Practical Hours below	
Syllabus must note that all applicable NFPA standards (NFPA 1001, 2013 Ed.) are followed - (see minimum hours required above)			
REQUIRED INSTRUCTOR QUALIFICATIONS			
Lead Instructor must be an approved AZCFSE Adjunct Instructor for Firefighter I & II. Requirements: NFPA 1001 Firefighter I and II and Fire Instructor (as applicable) - see Adjunct Instructor Application for additional information.			

ROSTERS AND EIN'S

- All Certification Programs require a **roster** submitted two weeks prior to the certification exam showing **names and EIN's** used as a tracking ID number
- An **EIN (Electronic ID Number)** can be obtained from the records database system online at www.erma.az.gov
 - See ERMA instructions on the website: azfiretraining.org on the Forms page
- Firefighter Certification Programs must also submit an **initial roster** within two weeks of the start of the program

FINAL ROSTERS

The following important rules regarding final rosters will be enforced:

- Final roster must come directly from the approved **Adjunct Instructor** for that program
- The appropriate **official Roster Form** from the AZCFSE website must be used
- The **Adjunct Instructor's signature** is required on the final roster
- All candidates who successfully complete a program must appear on the final roster in order to be eligible to test as part of that program
- If a candidate completes all program requirements but is not 18 years old on the date of the test that should be noted on the roster along with the date the student will turn 18. Students who turn 18 less than one year from completion of a program may test after their 18th birthday.

CERTIFICATION TESTING FEES

- All Certification Programs require a **testing fee** submitted prior to the certification test by either department check or student money orders/cashier's checks
- This certification testing fee allows students **3 attempts within one year** of completion of the program in both the written and practical exams
 - All programs require a written exam but not all programs require a practical exam
- Students not successful within 3 attempts, or after a year has lapsed, must retake a certification program prior to testing again.

CERTIFICATES

- **Certificates** are mailed to the program **Adjunct Instructor** for distribution to students
- Successful candidates receive a Certification suitable for framing and a wallet sized card



CERTIFICATION TESTING SUCCESS IS SEPARATE FROM PROGRAM SUCCESS

Keep certification separate from any determination of academic success in the program:

- The measure of a student's academic success cannot involve certification testing
- Success in a program comes first and certification success can take up to a year and 3 testing attempts

PREREQUISITES FOR CERTIFICATION TESTING

Candidates for any AzCFSE Certification must:

- ✓ Complete an approved Certification Program and all program requirements
- ✓ Appear on the Program Final Roster signed by an authorized Adjunct Instructor
- ✓ Or meet the guidelines for Reciprocity Challenge Testing
- ✓ Submit a payment for the testing fees
- ✓ Be 18 years old at the time of the Certification Test



FIREFIGHTER PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

All Candidates for **Firefighter Certification** must also meet the certification program requirements for:

- ✓ EMS and Bloodborne Pathogens
- ✓ CPR Certification
- ✓ Hazardous materials prerequisite
- ✓ Live burns meeting the NFPA standard



FULL DISCLOSURE OF TESTING PROCESS AND INSTRUMENTS

- IFSAC Requires **full disclosure** of test instruments
- At the beginning of a program each student must receive access to:
 - A copy of “Preparing for Certification Testing”
 - A complete set of Practical Skill Evaluation Sheets from AzCFSE
 - ✓ AzCFSE skill sheets and “Preparing for Certification Testing” form are posted online at **azfiretraining.org**

THE WRITTEN EXAMINATION

- Multiple choice exam
- **50 to 100 question** depending on the level being tested
- **Passing score 70%** on all required sections of the exam (i.e. Firefighter I questions and Firefighter II questions)
- A retest requires a 30 day wait before the next attempt

THE FIREFIGHTER & HAZARDOUS MATERIALS FRO PRACTICAL SKILL EXAMINATIONS

- **Randomly** selected AzCFSE Skill Sheets
- One Firefighter skill will require donning an SCBA
- Candidates are evaluated by **Program Evaluators**
- **Evaluators** are selected by the program and must:
 - Be certified in the level they are evaluating or higher
 - Have previous teaching experience
 - Only evaluate students on skills that he or she did not teach to the candidates being evaluated
 - Be listed on the AzCFSE final test roster as Evaluators
- An AzCFSE **Proctor** is present to ensure objectivity of testing environment

PRACTICAL EXAM (continued)

- Success in examination is **pass or fail**
 - Candidates know results when they leave
- Test method
 - Two attempts at each skill station
 - Maximum of 10 minutes at one skill station unless otherwise noted
- There is no waiting period if another attempt is required



RE-TESTING

- Candidates must contact AzCFSE to schedule a retest after viewing the list of **scheduled tests**.
 - Information for scheduling is listed on the **Testing Schedule page at azfiretraining.org**
- **Written** retests
 - Require a 30 day wait from original test
- **Practical** skill retests
 - No wait required to retest
 - Candidate must provide their own SCBA and full PPE
